


ADORER Q & A

What time is the chapel open? The chapel is open from 11am-10pm Sunday-Friday. We need more adorers to fill Saturday. Please tell any friends interested to email adoration@saintvincents.org if they're interested in helping us open up Saturdays! We hope to expand the hours over the next few years.

Where is the chapel located? The address of St. Vincent's is 2375 E Arizona Ave., Denver, CO, 80210. Once you arrive at the church campus, you'll want to go to the corner of Arizona Ave. and Josephine St. There's an outdoor patio. Walk inside there and you'll see the entrance to the chapel (under the big copper awning).



How will I get into the Adoration Chapel?

For now, the adoration chapel will remain unlocked during adoration hours, 11am-10pm. You should not have an issue getting into the chapel. If you do, call your day coordinator or our main parish office. When you arrive, you will need to sign-in on the iPad near the entrance of the chapel each week.

How do I sign up for an hour?

You can always stop in whenever you'd like, but if you'd like to claim a weekly hour, just go to adorationpro.org/vincentdenver.

WHAT TO DO IF...

What do I do if I cannot come on my appointed time and day?

We have a wonderful automated sub system, but we don't want to wear out our subs! Our goal is to only make an online request if it's absolutely necessary. If you know you can't make your hour one week, do the following:

1. Text/call the other person assigned to your hour. As long as you are sure one other committed person will be there, that's all that you need to do. If the other adorer at your scheduled time will be there, you do not need to request a sub! You're done!
2. If they won't be there or you're the only one on your hour, before you request through the system, try to find your own sub (friend, family member, etc.) by asking around. If you find someone you know will show up, you're done and don't need to request a sub through the system. Be sure to tell them to sign-in and to take the "Guardian of the Eucharist" banner when they arrive.
3. When the first 2 fail, then use the sub system. On www.adorationpro.org/vincentdenver, click 'Find a Sub'. The password is *adore*. Once you've submitted the request, you are finished.

What do I do if no one comes and my hour of adoration is finished?

It is wise to get to know the adorers who come before and after you. Get their names and telephone numbers, and ask them to call you if there are any changes in their schedule so you don't worry. If no one has showed up, if you can, wait few minutes - the next person may just be delayed. If the next adorer still does not come, follow the steps below:

1. If there are other people in the chapel, speak out loud that you are the committed adorer and no one has shown up yet and that you need to leave. Ask if there's anyone planning on staying until the next hour. If yes, pass off the banner to that person and leave.
2. If you have the time to text or call a friend/family nearby to relieve you, do that.
3. If neither work, repose the Eucharist and you can leave. MAIN POINT: Jesus should never be left alone without a committed adorer responsible for keeping watch. It is better to repose than to leave Him without a guardian!

WHAT TO DO IF (continued)

How-to Expose/Repose

Repose only when necessary. To repose, kneel before the Eucharist. Turn the monstrance to the side. Open and slide out the Eucharist (it's on a 'track'). Hold it close to your heart and go place it in the tabernacle. If the tabernacle is locked, the key is hanging on a hook on the back of the tabernacle stand, right side. Genuflect and close the tabernacle door. Leave the monstrance turned to the side so people know Jesus is reposed.

If you ever arrive at the chapel and the Eucharist is reposed (even if you're just stopping in), you have the authority to expose as long as you know there's a committed adorer there. The process is the same as above, in reverse.

What do I do if someone unruly enters the Chapel?

Do your best to be as kind and respectful as possible. If they are being disruptive, kindly ask them if you can speak with them outside. Once you get them outside the chapel, simply let them know you are glad they are here, but this is a place for silent prayer. Most people will understand and either enter more respectfully or leave. If the situation escalates, either call Steve and Christie Walsh, or if you feel in immediate danger, call the police.

What if it's snowing?

If St. Vincent's school is closed due to snow, we will close the chapel as well. We will send out an email and text letting every scheduled adorer that day know that it is closed due to inclement weather.
